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## Haemostasis Awards

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### ABOUT MARTIN VILLAR AWARD

Dr. Martín Villar (Valencia, Spain 1922-2011) was a world-renowned hematologist, who pioneered the treatment of hemophilia in Spain.

In 2007, as a tribute to his career, and to honor his contribution to the management of hemophilia, Grifols launched the Martín Villar Awards Program, with the aim of identifying and supporting innovative clinical and scientific work that offers a greater insight into hemostasis.

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### THE MARTIN VILLAR PROGRAM

The Martín Villar Haemostasis Awards aim to recognize the value of young investigators who devote their activities to basic or clinical research into hemostasis and bleeding disorders. By recognizing and rewarding the most outstanding scientific work published, the program aims to encourage further investigation in this field.

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### ELIGIBILITY

Applicants must meet the following criteria to apply for the Martín Villar Awards:

- All submissions must constitute an original contribution to basic or clinical research in hemostasis and be specifically related to bleeding disorders.
- Researchers must be under 40 years old.
- The work presented must have been published in English in 2014 in any of the international journals referenced in the science citation index.
- Basic research includes preclinical animal studies and in vitro studies.
- Clinical research includes any studies requiring patient informed consent, including treatment of patients and/or use of patient samples (e.g. for biomarker analysis, genotyping and diagnostics).
- Clinical case reports and reviews are excluded.
- Studies sponsored by industry are excluded.

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### APPLICATION PROCESS

To take part, candidates must complete the form provided at [www.grifols.com](http://www.grifols.com). Select the Grifols Scientific Awards banner on the home page that will lead you to the Martín Villar Hemostasis Awards. In addition applicants must submit the following in English:

- Basic details of professional position.
- Short CV of the author or authors.
- A copy of the original work in PDF format.
- Letter of recommendation from the applicant's mentor verifying the original research and the nature of the applicant's contribution.
- A conflict of interest statement disclosing the sources of funding.
- Bibliographic reference of the published work.

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## APPRAISAL CRITERIA

The panel of experts will be looking for significant contributions to basic or clinical research in the field of hemostasis that are specifically related to bleeding disorders.

Applications are evaluated based on four aspects:

- Innovation and originality of the work.
- Quality of the research: State of the art, design of the experiments or clinical trial.
- Scientific merit.
- Clinical and medical impact.

The names of the successful candidates will be published in June 2015 on the Grifols website. The awards ceremony will be held during the final quarter of 2015 during which the winners will give a short presentation of their work.

All prize-winners will be given a certificate in recognition of their achievement.

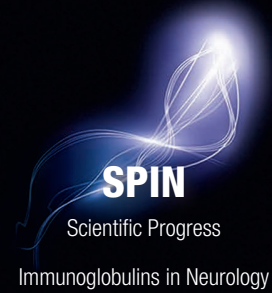
